- **Cosmetology-** At the successful completion of this course, students will have the opportunity to take the Cosmetology State Board Licensing exams (practical and written) for certification and licensing as a professional cosmetologist.
- **CAD- AutoCAD CERTIFICATION-** The AutoCAD Certification include both academic and industry requirements designed to confirm that Autodesk AutoCAD software users have the skills necessary to continue their design careers whether they attend college, enter the workforce, or work toward additional levels of industry certification.

# Certification Programs & College Credits

- **JROTC-Students** will have the opportunity for four-year college scholarships offered by ROTC programs of the Army, Navy and Air Force. This JROTC program also provides nominations to the United States Military Academy at West Point, the U.S. Air Force Academy and the U.S. Naval Academy. For students who wish to take advantage of the GI Bill for college, JROTC provides highschool graduates with advanced promotion and higher pay when enlisting in the active U.S. Armed Services, Reserves or National Guard. A student who participates in JROTC has absolutely no obligation to serve in the Armed Services of the United States.
- **TOMORROW'S TEACHERS-** A program to encourage students with exemplary interpersonal skills to consider teaching as a career. This program develops future community leaders who will become civic advocates for public education. The course is for Junior and Senior students. Students receive three credits from Kean University after completing the course. Students complete fifty observation hours at schools all across Union!

- Won State of New Jersey Drill Championship for 25th consecutive year.

- 120 out of 128 cadets participated in the Union County St Patrick's Day Parade.
- Conducted a fundraiser which raised \$36,560 for the program.

### KAWAMEEH MIDDLE SCHOOL CLIMATE CHANGE

Kawameeh Middle School coordinated the first annual KMS Climate Convention on Friday, March 28, 2025 at the Jack DeBarbieri Gymnasium.

This event is the culmination of a cross-curricular project between our 8th grade Science and English teams, inspired by the book *The 21* by Elizabeth Rusch, which explores the landmark climate lawsuit against the U.S. government. Through a generous grant from the Education Foundation, the participating teachers were able to provide copies of the book to the students, sparking thoughtful discussions on climate change and empowering students to take action.

For the project, students researched climate solutions and developed presentations focused on key environmental issues such as solar panels, electric cars, plastic recycling, wind farms, and ocean cleanup. During the Climate Convention, students displayed their projects in a gallery walk format, where visiting students from 6th and 7th grades had the opportunity to view presentations, ask questions, and vote on the most impactful solutions.


