Housed in the Life Skills classroom at Union High School, this student-run laundry service offers a convenient, professional-quality laundry drop-off and return system for school staff and students.

Mission Statement

To empower students with disabilities by providing hands-on vocational training while offering a helpful and high-quality laundry service to the school community.

Services Offered

Drop-Off Laundry Service:

Clean, folded laundry returned within 24–48 hours.

Schedule:

Operates 3-4 days per week during school hours.

Service Process:

- 1. **Drop-off:** Staff/students place laundry in labeled bags at the designated area.
- 2. Processing: Students sort, wash, dry, fold, and package items.
- 3. **Pick-up:** Laundry is returned to the customer with a thank-you note or service ticket.
