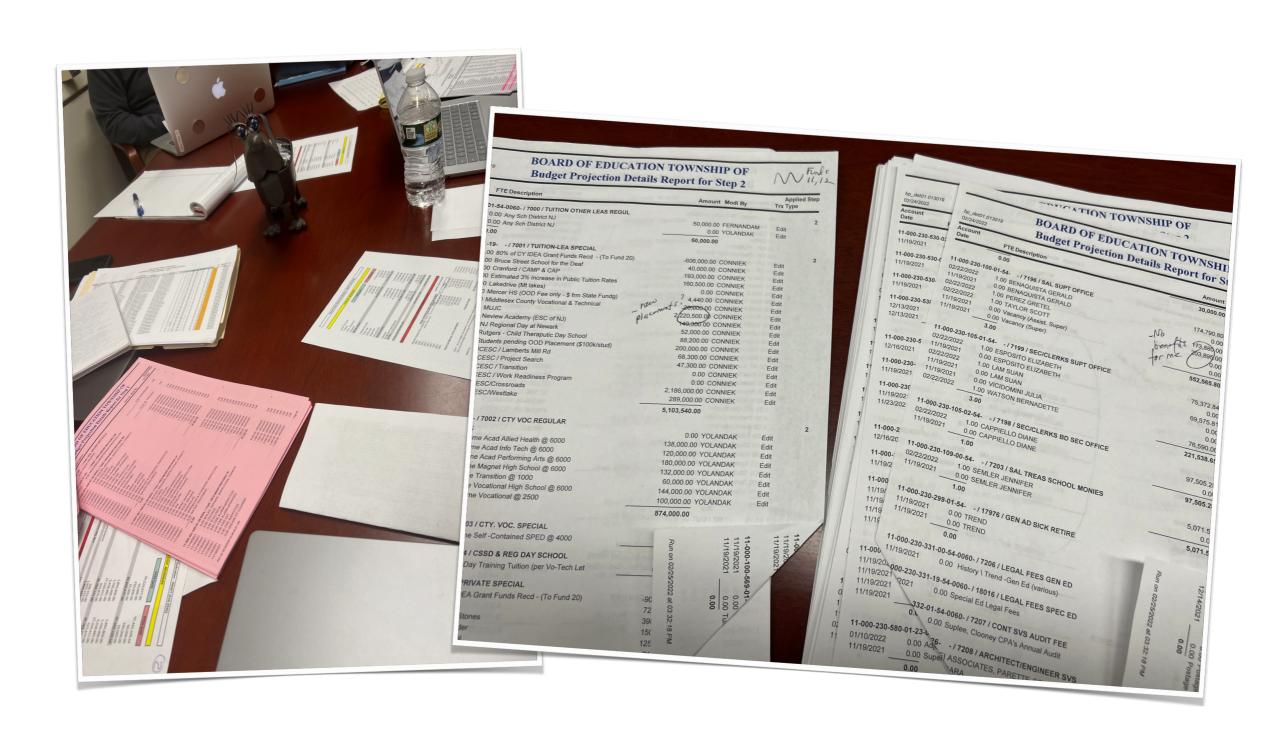

Fiscal Year 2023 Budget Challenges

The school district provides a wide variety of services to 7,306 students in 10 schools.

It takes 1,078 employees to sustain services.

It's necessary to send 150 students with great special needs to other schools.

Our district needs to be competitive with other districts to retain and attract bus drivers and bus aides.

Our district cannot afford to lose personnel.

District reserves have not been effectively replenished over the last several years.

Fiscal Year 2023 Budget Challenges

The state has underfunded New Jersey school districts for decades.

A 2% limit on local taxes is below the rate of salary, health benefit, and inflation increases.

Fiscal Year 2023 Budget Solutions

Balance the budget without any reductions in force (RIF) or elimination of positions by using additional ESSER III funds and "fund balance" (savings from 2021-2022)

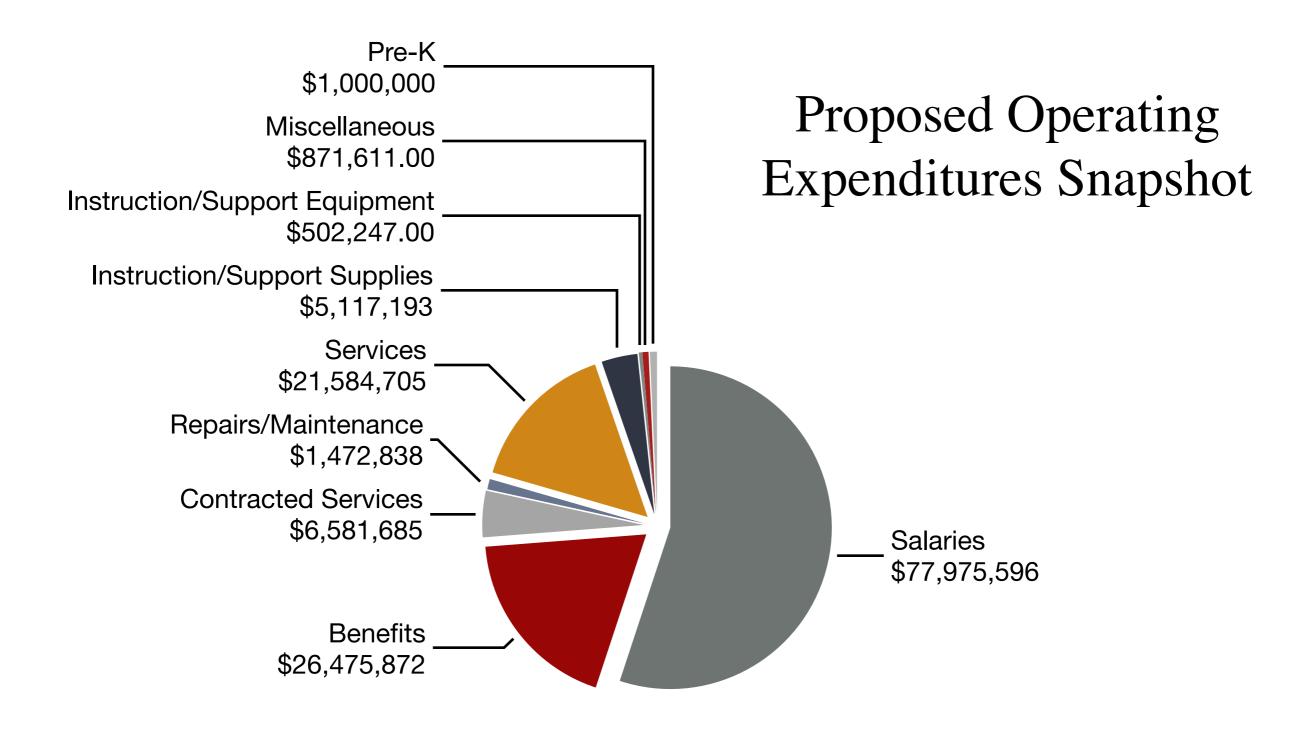
Provide bus drivers and aides salary increase and single-coverage benefits using additional state aid

Replenish reserves by using fund balance

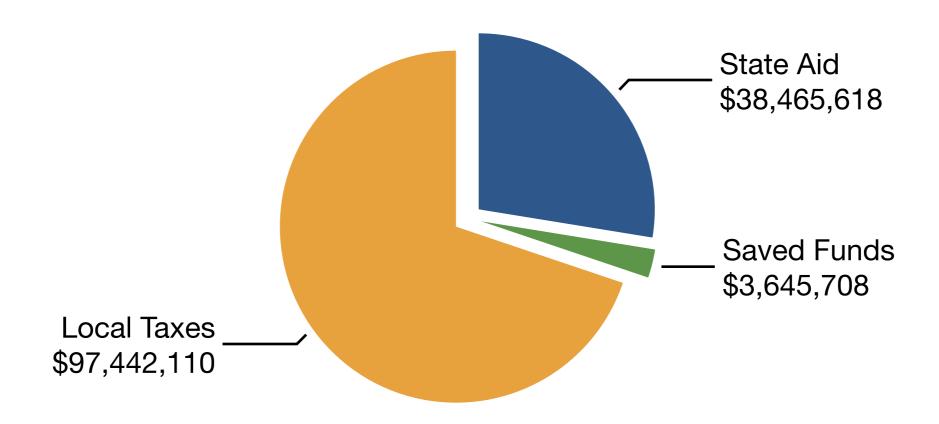
