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RESOLUTION EARLY CHILDHOOD PRESCHOOL BUDGET 2024-2025

WHEREAS, the Township of Union Public Schools is required to submit a FY2024-2025 budget to the New Jersey Department of Early Childhood Education. This budget supports the operation of the Township of Union preschool program to meet the needs of its preschool population over the next school year. The budget continues to incorporate the use of contracted community childcare providers as well as in-district preschool self-contained classrooms to provide universal preschool to Union residents.

This is annual funding from the New Jersey Department of Education for preschool services to three (3) and four (4) year old children. The FY 2024-2025 budget submission total is \$8,867,462.00.
