



ELEMENTARY STEAM FAIR






Mikarla Portuondo - Mikarla is a Junior member of the Union High School Track team. This season, she competed in the 55m, 400m and 4X400. Mikarla won the North Jersey Section 2 Group 4 Sectional Championship in the 55m with a personal record of 7.34 seconds and 2nd place in the 400m with a personal record of 59.37 seconds.



Gabe Hargrove at 126, A Junior on the Union High School wrestling team, Gabe finished his season with a 36-7 record. Gabe finished third in Region 4 and qualified for the state wrestling championship in Atlantic City. He finished in the Top 32 out of 325 wrestlers at 126 lbs in the state. He was also the champion of the Dover Holiday Tournament and Gary Vittorio Tournament at Par Hills.



Christine Pierre-Louis - A senior wrestler on our wrestling team. She finished her season 17-8. She won the Union County Championship at 185 lbs and placed 3rd in North Region 2. She qualified for the NJ State Wrestling Championships in Atlantic City and finished in the top 16 female wrestlers in the state at her weight class.



Alissa Alcindor - Alissa finished her senior season with a 27-1 record. She was the Union County Champion and was the North 2 Region Champion at 215 lbs. Alissa qualified for the New Jersey State Wrestling Championships in Atlantic City and finished in second place in the state of NJ. Alissa placed first at the Bloomfield Girls Tournament, the Elizabeth Lady Minutemen Tournament, and the Bergen County Girls Invitational Tournament. Alissa was the Union County Girls Wrestler of the Year, voted by NJ.com.


