Our Most Valuable Resource is Time

Academic - time devoted to content-based subjects

Enrichment - non-core offerings

Lunch/Recess - breaks and playtime

Maintenance - non-learning activities

64% on Academic 12% on Enrichment (Hess, 2023)

Union's Breakdown

- K-4 Full Day = 380 minutes
- Grades K-4 spend between 15%-20% of the week on enrichment
- Special Area teachers are often used to cover classes
- Students still have a lot of growth to make in academic areas

The Goals

- 1. **Preserve** and **increase** enrichment opportunities for our students
- 2. Enhance the staff and student **supports** in our buildings
- 3. Improve the **efficiency** of our instructional day to ensure we are purposeful with how we use our time

Preserve and Increase Enrichment Opportunities and Enhance the Staff and Student Supports

1. Preserve Enrichment Opportunities

- All students will still receive instruction in the current enrichment courses
 - Phys Ed/Health, Art, Music/Chorus, Library, Computer Science & Literacy, World Language
- Budgeted Permanent Building-Based Substitutes

2. Increase Enrichment Offerings

- Addition of S.T.E.A.M. course
- After School Enrichment Program (Art, Music/Chorus, Computer Science & Literacy)

3. Enhance staff and student supports in our buildings

- Literacy Coaches
- Reading Specialists

Improve the Efficiency of Our Instructional Day

1. Improve enrichment course scheduling

• Semester Model with "sister schools"; for example:

School 1 (Fall) / School 2 (Spring)

- Phys. Ed./Health (full year 2x/week)
- Library
- Music/Chorus
- Computer Science & Literacy

School 1 (Spring) / School 2 (Fall)

- Phys. Ed./Health (full year 2x/week)
- Art
- World Language
- S.T.E.A.M.
- 2. Increase academic instructional time as much as:
 - 80 minutes per week in Grades K-2
 - This equals an increase of 72 academic periods per year.
 - 120 minutes per week in Grades 3-4
 - This equals an increase of 108 academic periods per year.

Staffing Impact

| Current Positions | New Positions | Difference |

| 6 Music/Chorus | 3 Music/Chorus | - 3 FTE |
| 6 Computer Sci & Lit | 3 Computer Sci & Lit | - 3 FTE |
| 6 Library | 3 Library | - 2 FTE / 1 moved to Jefferson |
| 4 World Language | 4 World Language | 0 FTE / 1 Position create at UHS |
| 0 S.T.E.A.M. | 3 S.T.E.A.M. | + 3 FTE |
| 0 Literacy Coaches | 3 Literacy Coaches | + 3 FTE |

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Highlights

- increase academic instructional time
- ensure exposure to all enrichment courses through a semester model while increasing those offerings
- provide after school enrichment opportunities
- add support for staff with 3 literacy coaches for the K-4 level
- transition to reading specialists in each building
- support buildings with a budgeted permanent building-based substitute
- ensure financial flexibility to address future staffing needs
