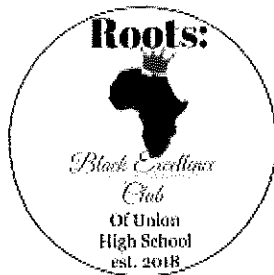

Club Structure:

Co-leader roles: In order to run for a club co-leader, one must attend **4** club meetings

- Secretary: The club secretary would keep record of attendendance, execute ideas discussed during meetings, and document club discussions/ topics. As secretary, one will be in charge of organizing club events with the help and the influence of other student leaders and co-leaders.
- Treasurer: The club treasure will be responsible for maintaining any monetary aspects regarding the club (events, fundraising, budget etc) and also discovering/maintaining programs such as scholarships, charities, etc.
- Public Relations: As PR, the student will be in charge of promoting club meetings and events in various ways (including social media, posters, announcements, etc.), reaching out to other clubs in the school and in the community, as well as encourage future club members.

Co-leader Role Criteria:

-A co-leader candidate leader must have attended at least 4 club meetings.

-A co-leader candidate must attain the majority of the member vote during the designated election period and must present a form of reason or presentation that you convince the members to vote for them (speech,presentation, poem etc.)

-Co leaders must make the attempt to accomplish any tasks or assignments assigned or suggested by the given timeline and must communicate efficiently with fellow executive members if any conflicts or difficulties should arise.

-Co leaders should make an attempt to attend designated executive board meetings (before school, afterschool, etc).

Student leader(s) role:

The student leader(s) will oversee the work of the co-leaders. They will not be required to attend every club meeting but, they will be expected to organize club topics/activities with the help of the co-leaders. Student leader(s) will be representing the club at meetings with the faculty advisor, administration, etc. Student leaders must be responsible, relatable, and ready to work!

Student Leader Rubric:

- Student leaders must be a general body member or co-leader for 1-2+ years.
- They must have at least one recommendation form filled from anyone in the school (general body members, previous club leaders, faculty advisor, teacher, etc)
- A potential student leader candidate must organize a club meeting in order to run for the role. The potential leader will choose the meeting topic, activity, etc. (ex. if 3 people run for a student leader role, each person will lead a meeting discussion each meeting.)Then, part of the student leader rubric will consist of votes from the general body members. While the previous leaders and faculty adviser will enter their input based on how the person led their designated club meeting.

Conclusion:

To conclude, this club is extremely overdue in my opinion. With a great population of students from all different parts of the world, this club will unify us all through history and modern culture. Eventually, there will be events held for black history month, Juneteenth, and more! Another plan would be to collaborate with other clubs like curls and confidence club, feminism club, international club and more in order to bring promote excellence and may prompt other ethnic groups or cultures to come together and to form similar groups to explore their own culture, This club will attract a great amount of people from all different parts of the diaspora and instill a sense of pride and unity amongst the students.
